

Brother Zephaniah Peters Needs Our Prayers

Dear Saints,

As most of you know, Bro. Zephaniah Peters from Tanzania was admitted on March 30th for a routine gall bladder removal in the Kilimanjaro Christian Medical Center. While preparing for surgery, his diabetes began to cause many problems. He actually remained in the hospital for almost one month. His condition is still poor, he is deaf, has almost no ability to communicate, and is very disoriented. The medication given to him for the diabetes seems not to be able to control the condition.

The family took him home from the hospital and informed us of his poor condition. We then began to make arrangements through my own doctor, (who was associated with Samaritan's Purse), to connect with an American doctor who lives near Nairobi, Kenya. As of right now, the family is making arrangements to fly with Bro. Zephaniah to Nairobi tomorrow for a complete evaluation, dialysis and any other treatment that the doctors feel would be appropriate. He will be admitted into the Nairobi Hospital which is considered the best private hospital in all of Eastern Africa, and they have the ability to perform dialysis treatments. He will arrive there on Thursday or Friday. I plan to travel there on May 18th for a few days to be with Bro. Zephaniah believing that he will be recovered and back at home at that time. Lord willing I will take some medical help and supplies with me for him to use.

We have established a fund through Hickory Bible Tabernacle for the cost of his medical treatment and travel. We are praying that the Lord will undertake for our brother and give him complete victory over this problem. He has been a very faithful servant and steward of the Bride of Christ in East Africa for many years.
